With one in three men and one in four women now being diagnosed with cancer in their lifetimes, cancer has become the epidemic of the developed world. Integrated treatment and prevention of cancers is an important specialty area of Chinese medicine across the world.

This seminar will teach the fundamental pathophysiology of cancers, their causes, and specifics that drive different treatments in conventional medicine and, therefore, integrated care. It will teach the nuts and bolts of integrating treatment with Chinese herbal medicine, the primary modality in integrated oncology.

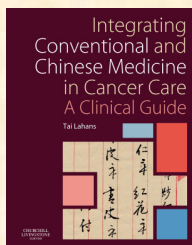
**Day One (Saturday, October 30th , 9:00-6:00, 8 PDA) -

Tai Lahans has practiced Oriental medicine for over 25 years. Clinically she has focused her attention on working with HIV/AIDS, other chronic viral diseases and with cancer. Her teaching experience is extensive, and in 2003 Tai founded the first residency program in integrated conventional and Chinese medicine in oncology. Lahans was voted Faculty of the Year at Bastyr University in 1998 and was awarded a Top Doc Award in 2003 from Seattle Magazine.

Her book "Integrating Conventional and Chinese Medicine in Cancer Care: A Clinical Guide," is the most complete manual, in English, for treating cancer with Chinese medicine to date. In it she covers many types of cancer and their treatment by conventional medicine integrating Chinese medicine. There are chapters on the main cancer types with separate chapters on issues that come about as a result of cancer itself and cancer treatment, the death and dying process from a medical perspective, and secondary prevention of cancer recurrence.

Tai has worked and lived in China for a total of four years, returning as often as possible and maintaining her relationship to teachers and researchers in Beijing, Shanghai, Chengdu, and Guangzhou. She sits on several boards supporting cancer patients. She has followed over 1000 HIV/AIDS patients – men, women and children, and has followed even more cancer patients from many walks of life.
